Crew Transfer Vessel

Introduction

This course will benefit qualified Skippers wishing to undertake the role of Crew Transfer Vessel master/coxswain. It is expected that delegates will have prior competency in the following areas:

- Basic Sea Survival Certificate (RYA/MCA) or BOSIET (OPITO) or equivalent
- VHF/DSC GMDSS Radio Operator Certificate (RYA/MCA)
- First Aid at Sea (1 day RYA/MCA) or HSE 4 Day First Aid at Work Certificate
- Yachtmaster Offshore
- Radar awareness and use

Training Content

By the end of the course delegates will be familiar with safety and risk aspects of crew transfer by sea, gain an awareness of best practice planning and preparation, become familiar with all equipment required on CTV and gain familiarity to participate in and co-ordinate emergency situations.

Module 1 of the course is classroom based and will cover the following:

Safety and Awareness

- Brief overview of legislation relevant to offshore operations
- Offshore hazards
- General standards of conduct for vessel operations
- PPE requirements for vessel transit and transfer
- Procedures for incident reporting

Vessel Management

- Use of electronic navigation aids and systems, radar, guard zones
- Safety brief
- Vessel safety checks and husbandry
- Stowage of equipment
- Maintenance (basic mechanical, electrical and fuel systems)

Personnel Transfer

- Safe methods of personnel and equipment transfer to and from a vessel
- Overview of different turbine designs to transfer methods

First Aid, Health and Welfare

- Signs and symptoms of hypothermia, heat exhaustion, sea sickness, dehydration and other conditions
- Casualty management
- Minor and life threatening injuries and conditions
- Basic first aid actions and common equipment in the marine environment

Emergency

- Vessel and facility emergencies
- Vessel abandonment, command and control
- Rescue and recovery at sea, search patterns, MPB recovery, deployment of electronic aids
- SAR helicopter passenger safety and emergency actions



Module 2 of the course is vessel-based and will cover the following:

- Leadership and team-working capabilities
- Passage planning, weather navigation overview
- Use of electronic navigation and safety equipment
- Vessel preparation and pre-departure checks
- Establishing and maintaining communications, crew and passenger safety brief
- Casualty location, recovery and management on board
- Approach and docking of vessel to structure and transfer of passengers
- Open water passage
- Simulated emergency scenarios and equipment/systems failure

Training will take place at Poole Marina.
